Dear School Community,

The construction of our 2016 School Pride Project has finally begun and will be finished at some stage in Term 3 hopefully. We are currently in a disconnection and demolition phase whereby everything is switched off, dismantled and in some cases, even destroyed! This will be followed by an internal construction phase, whereby internal walls are re-built to reflect the new floorplan and all rooms and passageways get new floor covers and a lick of paint in the Main Building.

Finally, the external (outside) construction will take place to update the school's façade facing Katamatite Road and new ramps and gardens will be established. We certainly look forward to moving into our Main Administration Building once the renovations are complete and unveiling our new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) Laboratory!

Swimming has been fantastic over the last week and a half and children are looking forward to the final 'fun' session in the last few days. This eight-day swimming program is a fantastic asset to the school and the swimming instructors employed by Aquamoves have done a fantastic job of accommodating our whole school in a single session.

NAPLAN Testing takes place next week for Grade Three and Five students. A total of four tests will take place in the areas of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Numeracy. All that we ask is for our students to give it their 'best shot' and our aim is to not put any undue pressure on our young chargers. This standardised test should only be seen as a 'snapshot' of your child on a certain day and is only one of many sources of assessment for our teachers to draw on before reporting. We have undertaken preparatory steps within our middle and senior classrooms and all that we ask you to do is to encourage your child to do their best and answer all questions.

Finally, *arriving on time to school is important*. We understand that it often takes a little longer to prepare for swimming days and that this is a change to routine, but we expect all students to be at school by 8:45am. When this does not occur, teachers need to return to mark the Attendance Roll, amend the Bus Roll or to run extra Pie Warmers to the Kitchen. This cuts into valuable teaching and learning time and is not fair to those that are on time. Please do your best to attend on time.


