Dear School Community,

It is that time of year when we turn our attention to planning. Congupna Primary School will be continuing with five classrooms in 2026, and we have now secured our fifth and final classroom teacher. Our Grade 5/6 students enjoyed Yachting on Lake Victoria in Shepparton yesterday morning. It was a perfect morning to learn all about port and starboard, bow and stern. By all accounts, most students ducked when the boom swung around after catching wind in the mainsail! Well done to Ms Mangiameli for modelling bravery and hopping in a boat this year!

Our 2026 Foundation Transition Day took place this morning from 9-11am. *It was great to see our ten new Foundation students getting to know their Teacher* and trying on new uniform for next year. We have six new families and another four siblings joining the school in 2026. On behalf of our whole school community, we welcome you and look forward to the privilege of educating your children in the years to come.

Our *F-2 Extended Stay and Sleepover also takes place this afternoon*. This is a wonderful opportunity for some of our youngest students to start expanding their horizons and become more independent. We see this school event as a very important stepping stone in having students attend three-, four- or five-day Camps in Grades 3-6. *Thank you to Mr Pettigrew, Ms Kuch, Mrs Sidebottom and Mr McKindley for taking time out of their own lives to provide this opportunity for our students.*
